A Personal Note from Pastor's Pen



The original Thanksgiving celebration was held by the Pilgrim settlers in Massachusetts just before their second winter in America in 1621. The first winter had been extremely brutal on them, claiming the lives of almost half of the 102 settlers. At one point, their daily food ration was down to five kernels of corn apiece. But in the middle of their hardest moment of their life, the unexpected began to happen. God began to show up in many different ways. God sent them grace in the eyes of some men of the Indian tribes, and by the next year, they had found better land and their crops brought in a plentiful harvest. So the Pilgrims, along with more than 80 Indians, spent time in feasting, praying, preaching, and in songs of praise to God. At this, the first Thanksgiving was born. We have come a long way as a nation in the past 400 years. Our tables will be spread with a much more plenteous harvest. However, there were some things present at that first Thanksgiving that we can't improve on. Like understanding the blessings we have do not come from our own ingenuity, resources, or hard work. The pilgrims understood that their diligence was necessary, but their dependency was ultimately upon God. They had broken up the fallow and hard ground, they had sown, they had poured much labor into the harvest, but it was God that gave the increase. The Pilgrims also understood the importance of celebration. They knew their need to set aside the time to celebrate what God had done by giving thanks for His provisions. This week, we have the same opportunity. So during this Thanksgiving, lets celebrate like the pilgrims and saints of old, by celebrating His Goodness with those around us. Let us remember that every good possession in our lives is a gift from God. Please don't allow the hustle and bustle of these days to rob you of deep appreciation. And always remember the scripture in *1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 Rejoice evermore. Pray without ceasing. In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.*
